
#### A NEW START IN WALES

## From Melanie Corbett, new Coordinator, Bridgend and Vale of Glamorgan

I took on the role of Area Co-ordinator, for the Bridgend and Vale of Glamorgan area, of South Wales, in early November.

Barely a few days in to the role, and Seaside Stitchers of Porthcawl were first to show me huge compassion by arranging a 'Sewathon' at their Arlington Road base, on Monday 29th November.

12 wonderful ladies cut and stitched for six hours to produce beautiful quilts to gift to the charity, from donations of fabric and wadding.



Looking to 2022 we have a project running with an aim to create 22 quilts a month. My superstar assistant is running sewing classes for those who are keen but have never quilted before, Our plans are largely dependent on how much of the funding, which I've applied for, comes in, and how much Covid impacts the meetings of the stitching groups in the area. But, what I'm am sure of, is that I'm going to continue to meet some wonderful people, who are going to create some wonderful quilts.



#### **Busy in South Herts and South Bucks.....**

Over the last month we have been very busy with new contacts and suppling them with beautiful quilts and blankets. Plus a Project Linus Day. (We thought we start the New Year with a bang)!

We decided to hold a Linus Day on the 19th January 2022 which we were uncertain about initially, due to COVID.

The responses were excellent. We had 18 Ladies from various parts of both counties attend in person, some came from as far away as Aylesbury. And we had several groups online, sewing during the course of the day. Our stocks of quilts has grown as a result of the day with many more on their way.

More from South Herts and South Bucks...

In December we were contacted by Daniel from the paediatric air ambulance as they were in need of incubator covers. We were able to offer sizable quilts which did the job. Daniel came to talk to us on our Project Linus Day. He travels from the main land to Jersey and the Channel Islands but also as far flung as the USA. He brings children and premature babies (some as young as 24 weeks) to the UK to be treated for various conditions, He told us so many vital things about his work which deepened our commitment.

We have also managed to donate to The Women's Centre Watford, Afghanistan refugees, Watford Rotary Club, Home Start, St Albans Women's Refuge, Aylesbury Women's Aid and Wycombe Women's Aid. We have linked up and again provided quilts, to the Steve Sinnott Foundation.
