Simple Linus Quilt 2


Fabrics used:

0.5 metres of A, 0.5 metres of B, 0.5 metres of C, and 1.5 metres of D – Backing Fabric

Cut Fabrics A, B and C into 6.5 inch squares.

Construct quilt top. Use any design of your choice or follow the chart below.

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For this pattern – one which avoids having to match the joins of the squares you will need to cut some of the squares in half horizontally.

(As all the squares are cut at 6.5 inches, you will need to drop the 3 'B' strips by roughly 0.25inches when joining the strips as they will be slightly shorter and then the top and bottom of the completed quilt top will need to be trimmed level!)

This pattern uses: 18 squares of 'A'

14 whole squares and 3 half squares of 'B' 14 whole squares and 3 half squares of 'C'

Complete the quilt using wadding and fabric D for the backing.

Quilt as you wish making sure the layers are secure enough for frequent machine washing.

You could add appliqué motifs to the completed quilt top.
